President's Report

Elizabeth MacKay, Chair

The skating season on Prince Edward Island is always a busy one, and this year was no exception. One season was just ending when we started to prepare for the next. There were, as usual, many events, training sessions and competitions to keep everyone busy including the skaters, parents, coaches and dedicated volunteers that keep the Section running smoothly.

Athlete Development

With the implementation of the new CPC judging system at the Sectional level this year, our eight PEI Sectionals entries were invited to Nova Scotia to join their skaters in a combined event. This also gave them a valuable competitive experience and warmup for those who advanced to Eastern Challenge in Toronto. Our skaters performed well and benefited from the increased level of competition.

In February, Summerside FSC hosted the Jr/Sr High School Invitational in conjunction with their Date to Skate event, and had great attendance from teams both on Island and off. It was a popular team building experience, one that we hope will continue in future and offer another option for our skaters of all levels to stay involved..

Our Provincial STARSkate competition continues to grow with an increase in the entries every year since its inception. This event was held in Kensington and hosted by the Section this year, in conjunction with the Provincial Synchronized Skating Championships. Winners from the Biathlon and Triathlon events advanced to the National STARSkate competition in Ottawa, and we were proud to have our Bronze Biathlon entry of Jonel Richard and Brittany Gallant of Evangeline FSC come home with the bronze medal. Way to go girls!

A freeskate mini-seminar was offered again and the Section organized and assisted with funding to bring in a former Senior Canadian dancer to partner our skaters in their Senior Bronze to Gold level dances. Thanks to BJ Sandiford for the many hours she devoted to this project.

Sherwood Parkdale FSC did PEI proud when they successfully hosted the Eastern Regional Festival of Synchronized Skating event in St. John, New Brunswick, with one bronze medal being secured. With 45 teams competing from the Atlantic provinces and Quebec, it was an exciting weekend for everyone involved and resulted in great media exposure for the sport. Congratulations for a job well done!

Our Recreational programs continued to enjoy increased exposure through seminars as well as our popular StarSkate competition. With 215 StarSkaters registered on PEI and 208 entries for our provincial competition, participation was phenomenal. Skaters from all clubs participated in dance, skills, freeskate and interpretive events over two days. Our Sectional Synchronized skating championships were held in conjunction with this event. From the StarSkate competition, two successful skaters went on to the National StarSkate competition in British Columbia, where they capably represented our Section.

Human Resource Development

Our judges and evaluators chairs, June Easter and Shannon Richards organized training sessions conducted by Marc Allain for our PEI judges in the new CPC judging system. This weekend session was well attended by our Island coaches as well.

Similar sessions were organized for the accountants by Nancy Hashie, our Accountants Chair and conducted by Gordon Markham of Ontario. Several of our accountants also traveled to New Brunswick Sectionals to complete their training. Thank you to all our volunteer officials who give many, many hours to our sport so that our skaters can compete and continue advancing through the test system.

Our coaches continue with their professional development with three of them attending Level 4 tasks in Moncton, which were offered in conjunction with Junior Nationals. Cornwall and Area FSC hosted a successful CANPowerSkate Coaches certification course in the spring of 2005 which was very well attended and resulted in several new coaches on PEI for this growing program. Skate Canada PEI is also proud to have Krista MacKay, one of only two coaches on PEI and 26 across the country, accepted to apprentice for the upcoming 2007 Canada Winter Games.

Skate Canada PEI along with the rest of the country, is concentrating on increasing membership at the grassroots level. Our first endeavor was a CANSkate coaches clinic conducted by Leona Boyle of Alberta. This was a fun day of making teaching aids, learning the tricks of the trade and generally getting enthusiastic about the CANSkate program. This clinic was attended by over 70 eager program assistants and professional coaches.

Organizational Development

In November 2005, we were thrilled to have Debbi Wilkes, Olympic silver medalist and well-known CTV commentator as our Honourary Chair for the first ever CANSkate Week on . Debbi went above and beyond the call of duty when she offered to travel to each and every club on PEI to speak to the members and parents, telling of her Olympic experience and creating enthusiasm about skating. Thank you to all the clubs who went the extra mile to make this project a success and a special thank you to Debbi. We were also fortunate to have TSN tape one of the sessions which was aired nationally during the Junior Nationals broadcast in March.

The Chairman's CANSkate Challenge offered two all-event tickets to the following year's Canadians Championships to the club in each Section with the largest increase in numbers of CANSkaters registered. Congratulations to Summerside FSC who won this inaugural challenge!

Partner Development

The PEI Provincial Government continues to be a loyal supporter of sport on PEI, funding various projects as well as the Executive Director program, which allows small organizations such as ours to have a shared full-time staff person. We also enjoy the support of various private businesses who sponsor competitions held across the Island, many of whom have been on board for several years, but we also continue to look for new support each year.

As I enter my final year as Section Chair, my goal is to continue with new projects, improve on returning ones and welcome ideas from the many parents, volunteers and skaters who make each season the success it is. It is only through working together and keeping our number one priority, the skater, in mind that we will continue to be the successful organization that we have become.

Accountants Annual Report

All 13 Club Competitions were held in a three week period in January. I would like to thank all of the accountants who help out in getting this work done in a very short period of time. I would also like to mention that with the new accountants that have come on board these past few years it has lightened the load for the rest of us and sure made the job easier for all of us. There were no storms to contend with this year and that was a big relief.

The other competitions that we worked at this year were, Interclub, ADL, Date To Skate/High School, STARSkate, Eastern Festival Synchronized. These were all done by our own accountants and we had no need to bring any in from other provinces. The High School part of Date to Skate was a challenge as it was our first time hosting this but we are now very prepared to do this again.

Our STARSkate is growing and is really a stretch for the chief accountant, computer accountant and the technical representative. The time that is put into this competition would shock you all. The section is continuing to experience a shortage of judges and evaluators, as are NB and NS. I would encourage coaches and skaters to take advantage of testing available during competitions. This season only competitive test were completed at STARSkate weekend. With five gold level evaluators available there were no shortage of judges. I would encourage at least five gold level judges to be used at STARSkate next year, and that unfamiliar judges be used in more of the higher events to give the skaters exposure to various judge; if not lower level judges may as well be brought in from NS and NB. However problems were experienced in previous years with a shortage of gold evaluators at this competition - planning is necessary.

To address the local judge shortage I would continue to encourage training. The club competition level will be experiencing shortages as students leave the province for university and other career goals. Two of our judges will be completing their degrees this year and I do not know where their plans will lead them. One judge will be leaving the province for university studies. There are two judges in training who may be able to participate at the primary and preliminary levels next season. Judges are unable to compete and judge in the same competition, both of these individuals are still competing.

Two of the juvenile judges continue to try to find a novice clinic that works with their schedules. I would recommend the section continues to support their efforts. I would also encourage training at the club competition and juvenile levels.

This has been a successful year for our skaters and judges. Without the support of the many volunteers those experiences might not happen. Thank-you to the club chairmen and their many committee members, to the judges, and skaters. It has been a pleasure to work with Sandra Caseley, Nacey Hashie, Barb Mayhew, Elizabeth Colwell, Tanya Gallant, Mary Ellen MacInnis, Sharon Fortier, judges and the many others who worked so hard to make PEI competitions happen.

Skater Development Committee Annual Report 2005-2006

Competitive Club

Competitive Club provides extra ice-time and enhanced training conditions for skaters across PEI who have passed competitive tests, or are on target to meet the requirements of a competitive test. Six sessions of Competitive Club were held over the 2005-2006 skating season, with twelve skaters registered. All sessions were held at the South Shore Actiplex, in Crapaud and included one hour of on-ice training and one hour of off-ice conditioning. On-ice sessions were coached by Julie McNeill and Kim Duffy and covered a range of skills offered at two levels. Off-ice training included three cardio and one mental training session provided by Gord McNeily, one dance class instructed by Julia Sauve and one nutrition session held with Allan Davidson.

Fall Youth Camp

Due to changes made by SkateCanada, only one Fall Youth Camp was held in Eastern Canada this year and awarded on a first come first serve basis. A decision was made not to enter an application to host this year's camp and instead focus more on offering Competitive Club this year.

Sectionals

PEI held its 2006 BMO Financial Group Sectional Championships in conjunction with Nova Scotia's Section in St. Margaret's Bay. This provided our five Pre-Novice Ladies and three Novice Ladies with a great learning experience and an opportunity to compete with other skaters from across Nova Scotia. Skaters were presented with their medals at a recognition ceremony held in PEI, where the Merit Award was also presented to Denise Davison.

Eastern Challenge

Seven skaters represented PEI at the 2006 BMO Financial Group Eastern Challenge held in Mississauga, Ontario on December 1-4, 2005. Our Pre-Novice Ladies placed 26th, 30th, 31st and 32nd and our Novice Ladies placed 21st, 22nd and 31st.

Canada Winter Games Training Team

Five Canada Winter Games Training sessions were held over the 2005-2006 skating season. Each session took place at the South Shore Actiplex in Crapaud, during the months of October, November, January, February and April. Each session consisted of one hour on-ice and one hour off-ice conditioning. Julie McNeill, coach for the Canada Games team, organized and coached all sessions. Eight skaters currently make up the training team, with the cut off for point accumulation on April 30, 2006. The Canada Winter Games team will be selected following the deadline.

Funding

Off-Island Funding:

Off-Island funding provides assistance to skaters for off-island training which supports each skater in their own personal skater development. The deadline for Off-Island funding was November 30, 2005. Eleven applications were received and funding was awarded to all those who applied. Four skaters received the minimum amount of \$300, two skaters received \$400, two skaters received \$500 and three skaters qualified for the maximum amount of \$800.

Eastern Challenge:

Funding in the amount of \$300 was given to all skaters who qualified for the 2006 BMO Financial Group Eastern Challenge Championships.

Elite Skating Funding:

After discussions with Board members, it was decided that Elite Skating funding would not be awarded this year and instead invested in Competitive Club.

Matched Grant:

Due to the discontinuation of funding for Matched Grant by SkateCanada, this funding was no longer available to skaters.
